People Fully Alive: Please be prepared to stay after the services on Sunday 16th and Thursday 20th October to discuss People Fully Alive and the St Mary's Mission Action Plan. The areas to be discussed are outlined in four papers; the third is included within this pewsheet. The final report will be included next week.

People Fully Alive Lever 1 – Nurturing a confident people of God.

Some of the priorities identified by the working group – much emphasis on training (an important part of nurturing):

- 1. **Encourage discernment and use of gifts** within the congregation by introducing a suitable course, *facilitated by an experienced professional*
- 2. **Nurture Team social activities** to build trust and confident relationships between the parishes that make up the team.
- 3. Get to know individuals better
 - a. **Welcome** receptions for those new to Linton revisit and revive.
 - b. **Revive Linton Churches Together** with renewed commitment to Joint Ecumenical Services held alternately at St Mary's and the Free Church
 - c. Befriending at events and services training required
- 4. **Regular training sessions** for those reading lessons and leading intercessions and to encourage more participation in these activities
- 5. Make the connection between Friday school service and regular Sunday services
 - a. Invite children from each class to a Sunday all-age service.
- 6. Maintain up-to-date Leaflets and Literature in church
 - a. Implement WiFi Internet access would this encourage people to come into church?
 - i. We rely on the website for disseminating information, access to it should therefore be available in church
 - b. Add slides to Sunday presentation on getting involved in church activities.
- 7. Helping children become teenagers confident in the church
 - a. Oasis online course (Staffordshire University), and others
 - b. School Chaplaincy Cambridge focused but how can we benefit in Linton?
 - c. Encourage enthusiastic leaders by offering training
- 8. Youth Encouragement Panels
 - a. Form a Youth Council to advise PCC
 - b. Facilitate youth debates on local and wider church issues
 - c. Build relationship with RE teachers in the local schools

The group had no shortage of ideas! Now it's your turn. What do you want to see go forward to the new Mission Action Plan for 2017?
