# Maggie writes about Church Opening and Worship during the current Lockdown

During this lockdown public worship and the opening of the church for private prayer continue to be permitted. However, we are also allowed to cancel public worship if we think it advisable. The church-wardens have met with me and Michael. We understand more of our church members will be anxious about coming to church in the current situation with the increasing infection rate. Others will want to continue coming to services in the building very carefully if they can. We believe that no one should feel they need to apologise for their decision, about this, nor feel under any obligation to do something which doesn't feel right for them, even if they have previously been on the rota to take special roles in the services.

Therefore, we have decided that for the time being we will continue to offer services in church on Sundays and Thursdays while we keep the matter under review. But we shall be following government and church guidance very meticulously: this will mean that we must be much stricter with ourselves about not chatting to each other outside our household bubbles before or after services; so, for example, the clergy will no longer stand near the door at the beginning and end to greet people and registration of attendance will have to be done with strict social distancing. It really would help if as many as possible could use the NHS app to sign in. We generally must make sure we don't approach too near to each other while we are in church except for the moment when we receive communion under very careful conditions.

Services may become much simpler, with the clergy taking on reading and interceding if and when we aren't able to find volunteers for these roles. 10 am services on Sunday may sometimes be 'said', without music if we cannot provide it and we anticipate being able to operate without a full quota of sidespeople if we need to. But the atmosphere should still be prayerful and meaningful (as it always is at our 8 am and Thursday 10 am services).

Meanwhile, we hope to have persuaded Zoom of our charitable status soon, so we can afford a church licence with multiple users for Zoom services (and other meetings), and we hope this may be achieved by next week. When we can, we may also post the 10 am service on Facebook live for those who would prefer this way of joining-in. (We know this medium is far from perfect, but it has been appreciated by some as a way of keeping in touch. We shall be using it this Sunday.)

On weekdays we shall continue to keep the church open, strictly for private prayer, with improved signage about Covid precautions, and I would like to thank those who make this possible.

As I have said, we shall keep all this under review, and no doubt the PCC will discuss it when we meet on Thursday (14th), so 'watch this space'. We shall do all we can to keep in touch with each other. If you would like to chat with me or Michael at any time - it doesn't have to be about anything serious or urgent - do feel free to ring, and we will try to be ringing people ourselves just to keep in contact.
