The Big Lent Read - A National Book Club: starting 17 February

The Big Lent Read with the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book Living His Story.

It's free to join in, either for individuals, home groups or whole churches. Through a series of short weekly videos released on the Sundays of Lent, author Hannah Steele will unpack liberating and practical ways of sharing the Gospel story afresh, and share how we can live Jesus' story in our own lives simply by allowing people to be drawn to him through our natural gifts. It's one more opportunity for making the reading of the book a shared experience with others, bringing communities to journey together through Lent despite being physically separated.

The Diocese of Ely and the Cambridgeshire Ecumenical Council have been linked with the <u>Diocese of Vellore in South India since 1992</u>. The wealth of sharing knowledge, prayer support and fellowship is evident in the many visits between the two dioceses. The Diocese of Vellore is in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu and centres on the town of Vellore itself. It is part of the Church of South India, a united church since 1947, made up from the Anglican, Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregational churches.
