Plant count - St Mary's Churchyard - June 2024

This was carried out by Judy & Keith Nightingale, Ken Clark and Anne Parry-Smith, mainly on 19 June 2024 and is part of *Caring for God's Acre* (a charity based in Shropshire) which invites churches to record plants in their churchyards every year at this time – Love your Burial Ground Week/Churches Count on Nature 2024. The charity works nationally to support groups and individuals to investigate, care for, and enjoy churchyards and burial grounds.

We found approximately 30 different species of wildflowers, plus several different grasses. There will be a list on the church noticeboard which also shows the flowers found in June 2021 by Judy Nightingale and Oriel O'Loughlin. Similar plant counts were also carried out in 1995 and 1996 by Ann Nightingale (Keith and Judy's daughter).
